All these were specifically written for this novel. F. Scott Fitzgerald was born in 1896 in Saint Paul, Minnesota, in Irish, catholic family (died in 1940). He was named after his famous distant cousin, Francis Scott Key (1779-1843) who was the author of the The Star-Spangled Banner™, the anthem of the United States of America. However, he was referred to as Scott™. In 1920, he married Zelda Sayre, the daughter of Alabama Supreme Court justice. Scott and Zelda Fitzgerald led an interesting social life in the US and in France, especially on the French Riviera. That period of their life abounded in scandalous events. In addition, Scott didn™t abstain from alcohol, which in the end proved to be fatal for him. In 1937 Scott Fitzgerald moved to Hollywood. He was writing short stories and also worked for film industry. Surprisingly, most of his income was coming from these activities (short stories and film industry) and not the novels he is nowadays famous for. Scott Fitzgerald died in 1940 of heart attack, which was caused by alcohol abuse. In 1975 he was buried with his wife Zelda at the Saint Mary™s Cemetery in Rockville, Maryland. Scott Fitzgerald was one of the lost generation™ of American writers. His writings were influenced by moral and societal changes in 1920s American society. This period was called The Jazz Age™, and Scott was its chronicler. F. Scott Fitzgerald wrote the following novels: - This Side of Paradise (1920) - The Beautiful and Damned (1922) - The Great Gatsby (1925) - Tender Is the Night (1934) - The Love of the Last Tycoon (published posthumously, 1941) He also wrote many short stories, as well as film scripts.
